ROMANCE & DATING

35% of teens have some experience with dating or romantic relationships¹. 18% are currently in one¹, 14% considering it serious, 5% not1. 12% ages 13-14 and 36% ages 15-17 in a relationship have had sex1. One in four teens dated someone they met online². Texting and talking are the two most common ways teens spend time with their partners, 72% texting daily and 39% talking daily². 85% expect to hear from their partner at least once a day, and 11% expect it hourly². Phones and social media lead to connecting, meeting and flirting⁵, but also break ups, jealousy⁴, abuse, unrealistic expectations³, sexting (10% of teens⁵) and more. The Bible says romantic relationships are designed by God to lead to marriage of man and woman (Gen 2:24) centered on Jesus (Eph. 5:32-33), and sex for marriage (Heb. 13:4) as a good gift (Prov. 5:18-19). We should prioritize God (Deut. 6:5), not rushing romance (Songs. 2:7). Christians should seek relationships with Christians (2) Cor. 6:14-15), respecting parents (Eph. 6:1) and church leaders (Heb. 13:17). Until then, we are to guard our hearts (Prov. 4:23) and treat each other in purity as family (1 Tim. 5:1-2) with God's guidance (Prov. 3:6).

STATS & QUOTES TO CONSIDER

35% of Teens Have Some Experience with Dating or Romantic Relationships; 18% Are Currently in a Relationship of Some Kind.

14% of teens are currently in a relationship they consider to be serious with a boyfriend, girlfriend or significant other.

5% of teens are in a current romantic relationship, but do not consider it to be serious.

Some 64% of teens indicate that they have never been in a romantic relationship of any kind.

Older teens are more likely to have experience with dating and relationships, and they also are more likely to be sexually active.

36% of 15- to 17-year-olds with romantic relationship experience have had sex, compared with 12% of 13- to 14-year-olds with relationship experience.

For today's teens, social media and modern technology play a huge role in how high school couples meet, communicate and break-up.

One in four teens have dated or hooked up with someone they initially encountered online.

Half of all teens have let someone know they were interested in them romantically by friending them on Facebook or another social media site.

47% of teens have expressed their attraction by liking, commenting or otherwise interacting with that person on social media.

Text messaging and talking on the phone are the top two ways that teens spend time with their romantic partners.

72% of teens communicate with their romantic partners through text every day, compared with 39% of teens in romantic relationships who talk on the phone daily.

85% of teen daters expect to hear from their significant other at least once a day, and 11% expect to hear from them hourly.

27% of teens with dating experience have had a partner use social media to track their whereabouts. Another 27% of teens with dating experience say social media makes them feel jealous or unsure of their relationship.

27% of teen daters have broken up with someone via text message, and 31% have been broken up with in this way.

43% of teen daters have untagged or deleted photos of themselves and a past partner on social media. In addition, 42% percent have unfriended or blocked someone they used to be in a relationship with on social media.

63% of teen daters who use social media agree that social media allows people to support them when a relationship ends.

Sometimes adolescents have idealistic views about relationships.

Some youth find themselves in violent dating relationships. Dating violence can be emotional, physical, or sexual. Dating violence also includes stalking.

Aside from in-person flirting, social media is the most common way teens express interest in someone they have a crush on.

Nearly three-quarters (72%) of teen daters say they spend time texting with their partner daily.

Technology can make teens feel more connected and closer to their partner; it can also cause feelings of jealousy and uncertainty.

55% of teens flirt with the object of their romantic interest and talk to them in person.

50% of teens friend them on Facebook or any other social network.

47% of teens interact with them on social media by liking and commenting on their pictures and posts.

46% of teens share some funny content with them online.

31% of teens send the flirtatious messages.

11% of teens create a music playlist.

10% of teens send flirty or sexy photos or videos of themselves.

7% of teens shoot a video.
