

BULLYING

Bullying is defined by Google as seeking to harm, intimidate, or coerce someone perceived as vulnerable. One third of American teens are bullied³. Young people who are perceived as different from their peers are often at risk for being bullied⁴. Persistent bullying can lead to or worsen feelings of isolation, rejection, despair or depression and anxiety, which can contribute to suicidal behavior⁴ or school shootings⁷. Types of bullying may include cyber, electronic, physical, sexual, verbal, social, psychological or emotional. The Bible says this behavior is wrong (Prov. 6:16-19), but we're to love our enemies and pray for bullies (Luke 6:27-28), live at peace with people as much as possible (Rom. 12:18), overcome evil with good (Rom. 12:21) and trust God to take care of bullies (2 Thess. 1:6). For those who've been or are being bullied, God defends the weak and oppressed (Psalm 82:3-4) and has a specific purpose for everyone (Eph. 2:10). The Bible says if God is for you, who can be against you (Rom. 8:31)? We are more than conquerors with Jesus (Rom. 8:37), and have a glorious, pain-free future ahead of us that's worth it all (Rom. 8:18, Rev. 21:4).

STATS & QUOTES TO CONSIDER

60% of middle school students say that they have been bullied, while 16% of staff believes that students are bullied.

160,000 students stay home from school every day due to bullying. (NEA)

30% of students who reported they had been bullied said they had at times brought weapons to school.

Bullying was a factor in 2/3 of the 37 school shootings reviewed by the US Secret Service.

28% of U.S. students in grades 6–12 experienced bullying.

70.6% of young people say they have seen bullying in their schools.

6% of students in grades 6–12 experienced cyberbullying.

6% of high school students (grades 9–12) were electronically bullied in the past year.

Most bullying happens in middle school. The most common types are verbal and social bullying.

Research indicates that persistent bullying can lead to or worsen feelings of isolation, rejection, exclusion, and despair, as well as depression and anxiety, which can contribute to suicidal behavior.

Bullied students reported that bullying occurred in the following places: the hallway or stairwell at school (42%), inside the classroom (34%), in the cafeteria (22%), outside on school grounds (19%), on the school bus (10%), and in the bathroom or locker room (9%)

Statistics suggest that revenge due to bullying is the number one motivator for school shootings in the U.S.

Girls have also borne the brunt of the rise in depressive symptoms among today's teens. Boys' depressive symptoms increased by 21 percent from 2012 to 2015, while girls' increased by 50 percent—more than twice as much. The rise in suicide, too, is more pronounced among girls. Although the rate increased for both sexes, three times as many 12-to-14-year-old girls killed themselves in 2015 as in 2007, compared with twice as many boys. The suicide rate is still higher for boys, in part because they use more-lethal methods, but girls are beginning to close the gap.

These more dire consequences for teenage girls could also be rooted in the fact that they're more likely to experience cyberbullying. Boys tend to bully one another physically, while girls are more likely to do so by undermining a victim's social status or relationships. Social media give middle- and high-school girls a platform on which to carry out the style of aggression they favor, ostracizing and excluding other girls around the clock.

Before social media, bullying was something only done face-to-face. However, now, someone can be bullied online anonymously

While social media made making friends easier, it also made it easier for predators to find victims. The anonymity that social networks provide can be used by the perpetrators to gain people's trust and then terrorize them in front of their peers.

Anonymity allows for cyberbullying. This is especially problematic for teens, as bullies can target and prey on vulnerable high school peers without taking personal responsibility.

Nearly half of young people (47%) have received intimidating, threatening or nasty messages online.

More youths experienced cyberbullying on Instagram than any other platform at 42%, with Facebook following close behind at 37%. Snapchat ranked third at 31%, and YouTube at 10%.

Seventy-one percent of the survey participants said that social media platforms do not do enough to prevent cyberbullying.

71% of young generations say they are concerned about cyberbullying

Girls (40.6%) are much more likely to be victims of cyberbullying than boys (28.8%).

A 2015 random sample study of 11-15-year old's in the Midwest found that over 34% reported being the victim of cyberbullying in their lifetime.

A study by McAfee, found that 87% of teens have observed cyberbullying

More than half of teens have witnessed cyberbullying on social media.

95% of social media-using teens who have witnessed cruel behavior on social networking sites say they have seen others ignoring the mean behavior; 55% witness this frequently.

66% of teens who have witnessed online cruelty have also witnessed others joining; 21% say they have also joined in the harassment.

1 in 6 parents know their child has been bullied via a social networking site.

In 2014, Teens who report being bullied say it was because of their: 61% appearance, 25% academic achievement/intelligence, 17% race, 15% sexuality, 15% financial status, 11% religion, 20% other.

There is online bullying among youth 8-17 worldwide.

Bullying over texting is becoming much more common.
