The purpose of the first paragraph is to reveal stats and quotes from mainstream sources about the growing struggles teens may have regarding each topic. The purpose of the second paragraph is to reveal God's perspective by seeing what the Bible says regarding each topic and how we can receive help and guidance in our life's purpose through a relationship with Jesus.

<u>DEATH</u>

Statistics show 10 out of 10 people die (you're welcome... for blowing your mind). Death is what all humans will face, but rarely talk about. The death rate for people ages 10-19 has shot up 12% between 2013 and 2016, and suicide up 56% from 2007-2016¹³. The top three causes of death among people ages 15-24 are accidents, suicide and homicide¹⁴³. Why do people die? How do we deal with it? What happens after?

The Bible says because we all sin, we all die (Rom. 5:12). God conquered death through Jesus dying (Heb. 2:14-15) as a perfect human (2 Cor. 5:21) and raising to life (1 Cor. 15:4). Now Jesus offers forgiveness of sin and eternal life after death (John 11:25) if we believe in Him (John 3:16) and live for Him (Matt. 16:24-25). We live and die once in this life (Heb. 9:27), with no reincarnation (Ps. 78:39), but a move to the next life either in eternal punishment and suffering (Hell) or life and blessing (Heaven) (Matt. 25:46), determined by our belief if the God of the Bible really is God and Savior through Jesus. Anyone who believes gets forgiveness of sins (Rom. 10:9) and eternal life in heaven (Rev. 21:4).

STATS & QUOTES TO CONSIDER

There has been a significant rise in accidental deaths, homicides and suicides among young people across the United States, and experts are calling it a wake-up call.

The total death rate for 10- to 19-year-olds in the United States declined 33% between 1999 and 2013 but then suddenly soared 12% between 2013 and 2016, according to a new report from the National Center for Health Statistics at the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (PDF).

This rise in deaths is attributable to injury-related deaths, such as traffic accident fatalities, drug overdoses, homicides and suicides, as opposed to illness, such as cancer or heart disease.

In general, the leading causes of death among adolescents ages 15 to 19 in the United States are unintentional injuries such as car crash-related injuries, followed by suicide and homicide, according to the CDC.

The data showed that suicide rates among 10- to 19-year-olds declined by 15% between 1999 and 2007, dropping from 4.6 per 100,000 to 3.9 per 100,000. Then the rate increased by 56%, going up to 6.1 in 2016.

"This should not be happening and bucks the trend that we as a country have experienced in the past several decades. We should be worried about this," said Weiser, who's also an associate professor of surgery at Stanford University School of Medicine.

When we talk about death – we talk it about it in a historical sense. We discuss the second world war and the tragic waste of human life, or we teach about the death beliefs of the Egyptians, but we don't tell them what it was like when their grandfather passed away in a hospice, or what it was like when the boy from our class at school was killed by a truck while motorcycle riding. We don't tell them what we think might happen after

we die, we don't tell them how we feel about it. We treat death like a terrible contagion. Almost as though we are risking the lives of our young if we talk about it – and I mean really talk about it – with them.

It's one of the few things that every single one of us face, and we often ignore it.

Numbness, shock, and disbelief - Especially when death is sudden or unexpected. These feelings provide a protective response that shields us from dealing with overwhelming emotions until we can face them. Our words are often "I don't believe it," or "it can't be true."

Anger, frustration, and rage - It is common to feel angry with God, the doctor, the person who died, or ourselves. We may blame God for allowing the person to die. We may blame the doctor for not helping the person to get well. We may blame the person for smoking or driving too fast. We almost always blame ourselves for all the "if only" and "what ifs" we can think of. Teens may say things like, "God is not real" or "Life is not fair."

How do teenagers understand death? ANSWER:

- Teenagers understand death with a personal and long-term view.
- They may want to talk to their friends more than to their parents.
- They understand more on their own, so adults are validating information rather than giving it.
- They understand their lives in the context of others', so they will want to leave a legacy and plan for their own deaths.
